

Spring cycling is (mostly) here



With 3 of the 13 HeartCycle tours complete, the bicycle touring season is just starting to warm up-and the same goes for everyone's day-today cycling as we embrace warmer weather and longer days. Spring cycling should be peaking right about now (as spring officially began on March 20 and ends on June 21). However, for much of the U.S., Mother Nature has a different idea this upcoming week.

I thought my ski trip two weeks ago would be the final hurrah—until a friend texted me a news article about the potential for 25" of snow heading our way! The headline grabbed my attention by mentioning an "Omega Block Pattern." I'd never heard of such a term. Regardless, more snow-and sadly, less riding-is in my immediate future.

If you're stuck indoors and don't have a bike trainer to spin on, consider these alternatives to help

keep your cycling muscles in tip-top shape: squats (builds quads, hamstrings, and glutes—all key cycling muscles), lunges (improves balance and targets legs and glutes), wall sits (builds isometric leg endurance, great for hill climbs), planks (builds core strength for stability and posture on the bike), and yoga and foam rolling (both great for flexibility, mobility, and recovery).



This tour gave us the rare privilege of witnessing an ancient culture, its traditions, exquisitely prepared foods that we were clueless to name, its Temples, the 6am Buddhist monks chanting of prayers, cherry blossoms at their peak, riding roads that gave us jaw-dropping views of the Pacific Ocean, and the unmatched beauty of the Japanese people that radiated calm and peace.

Our guides and fellow cyclists made it all so easy to enjoy the fullness of the present moment. This tour was a true gift and so utterly unique to any other. I am so grateful to have been a part of it.

Now that we are back, we can still feel misty mornings, roads dusted with cherry blossoms, laughter and bewildered looks at shared meals. It gave us sights, scents, and memories we will share for years. Until our next HeartCycle journey...









This tour will be in the heart of the Colorado Rocky Mountains through Summit, Grand, Eagle, Garfield, and Lake Counties—home to world-renowned ski resorts and historic mining towns.

This tour starts with shorter distances and smaller climbs and builds each day, giving us time to acclimate to the altitude. Generally, the climbs are steady and typically do not get much over 7%. The first three nights are in the scenic small town of Frisco, Colorado, nestled alongside Lake Dillon, surrounded by pine trees where we can breathe in the fresh mountain air. We bike

from Frisco to our second small town of Eagle, Colorado, 30 miles west of Vail. We will spend our day off in Eagle resting our legs and lungs, before biking to No Name, at the west end of Glenwood Canyon. Then we head back to Frisco for our final two nights and a truly epic ride up and over Fremont Pass to the highest incorporated city in the U.S., Leadville, Colorado, topping out at just over 10,000 ft. Detailed route maps, cue sheets and RWGPS files will be provided in advance to tour participants.

The bike path through Glenwood Canyon is just one of the many amazing areas you will encounter during the trip.
