Hudson River Valley Ramble September 30-October 5th, 2013 By Judy Siel

It was a week of perfect weather for bicycling and sightseeing: 50-70 degrees, sunny, no wind and a great group of HeartCycle members. We gathered in downtown Albany, New York in late September and after a few miles we were out of town and headed south along the Hudson River to Kingston, NY for the first days ride of 66 miles. The views off the two long bridges crossing the Hudson River were beautiful. That evening, it was a real treat to attended the premiere showing of "A Winter of Cyclists" at the Kingston theater, a documentary film by Mike Prendergast (HeartCycle Member). We had a private charter bus take us to the viewing. Mike and six others of our tour group who were were featured in the film, did a question/answer session after the film. Day two found the group heading west into the Catskill Mountains to see the beginning colors of fall foliage. It was a great route along quiet roads for 65 miles and 4,000 climbing to the Minnewaska Lodge. The group was shuttled into New Paltz ~5 miles for dinner.

Day three was a lovely loop around the Catskills up to the top of the "Gunks" for 59 miles and a final climb up an 18% hill back to the Minnewaska Lodge. UGH!





Day four we headed back towards the Hudson River through New Paltz and biked by six houses built before 1720; and then we crossed the Hudson River a third time on the brand new bike/pedestrian bridge into Poughkeepsie. That afternoon we biked along more quiet rural roads to the small village of Rhinebeck.





Day five was an a day to choose between two loops: the southern loop took in Mills Mansion, Vanderbilt Mansion, Hyde Park and Eleanor Roosevelt home. Unfortunately due to the Federal Government Sequester and associated shutdown, the properties owned by the US Park Service were closed. Several bicyclists (not naming names) snuck in the side gate and biked by the mansions without the usual crowd of visitors! The southern loop had perfect weather. The few who choose the longer northern loop got caught in a rain shower. The fabulous country scenery and roads were a delight to bike whichever route one choose. A few cyclists did neither and enjoyed a little well deserved R&R in Rhinebeck.





The final day of bicycling was a return north to Albany and luckily, the rain had held off until after all the bikers were safely into the hotel and the bikes were packed for everyone's trip back home. We dodged a downpour getting from the hotel to a fun group dinner at El Mariachi Mexican Restaurant.
