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## Notes from the Board

### Tour Announcement and Registration Policy

Upcoming tours generally are developed by Leaders and scheduled by the Tour Director in the year before they are offered. Advance announcements of tours may be included on the website and in the club Newsletters at any time.

US Based Tours may be previewed in the Newsletter and/or on the website in the fall and are formally announced at the annual meeting in October. Then, an email is sent to current members just before registration is opened for each tour. Tours are opened for registration on a staggered schedule starting about November 1 through December 1. If additional tours are subsequently added to the schedule, an announcement of the tour and registration is sent by email to current members and posted on the website. The tour will be also be discussed in the next Newsletter when it is issued.

International Tours are typically announced on the website and in the Newsletter up to a year before the tour, and before registration is open. Then, an email is sent to current members before the tour registration opens.

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## Springtime in the Santa Monica Mountains, April, 2013

From April 15 through April 20, 2013, Bob Rowe and Sy Katz, supported by Mayoma Pendergast and Jolene Thompson, led a wonderfully organized, injury free, “climbing camp” in the Santa Monica Mountains of California. Most of the participants were from Colorado but there were also old and new friends from British Columbia, California, Maryland, New Mexico, Nevada and Pennsylvania.

The Santa Monica Mountains are northwest of Los Angeles, on the coast where it bends from north–south to east–west, just north of Malibu. It is a range of mixed sedimentary and volcanic rock running parallel to the coast, perpendicularly traversed by steep canyons. In spite of the fog and cool mists from the ocean, it is semiarid with sun–baked rock, scrub and cactus. The area is an archipelago of state and federal parks with interspersed residential communities like Agoura Hills and West Lake. There are a few vineyards and stables. Those communities do like their colors so that in many areas, the roadside was ablaze with brilliant bougainvillea.



### Santa Monica Mountains - so close to LA

The fixed base for the week was the Agoura Hills Sheraton, north of the Santa Monica Mountains. It was a comfortable hotel with a great buffet breakfast and a variety of nearby restaurants and brew pubs.



The usual rides were 45 to 55 miles and between 4700 to 6000 feet of elevation gain, starting with morning climbs up and through the mountains to the south, followed by long, fast, refreshing descents down the canyons to the coast. After a lunch by the breaking waves, directions were reversed, climbing back north and a descending return to the hotel, usually by a different route.

The climbing was arduous at times with sustained segments of 9–10% grades and intervals of up to 17%. The week began cool and with a first climb of 5 miles at 7% average grade, but the skies cleared and it progressively warmed up so by the last day, there was both heat and pitch to deal with. On weekdays, the roads were eerily free from traffic, given the proximity to L.A. Saturday was different. The roads blossomed with high performance motorcycles, Porsche and Ferrari rallies, and cyclists everywhere.

A high point of the trip was the excursion to Mt Baldy, a major climb recently used in the Amgen Tour of California. Mt Baldy is not in the Santa Monica Mountains but approximately 45 miles due east, requiring a road trip that allowed the group that went to experience driving in twelve lanes of rush hour traffic, both directions. Our route started with a 26-mile 7,000-ft climb up Glendora Mountain Road to Glendora Ridge Road to the Mt Baldy Road. The grade for the final 4 miles averaged about 9% and “contains ramps of 12–14% through steep switchbacks. The climb... “is

significantly longer and almost as steep as the famous Tourmalet in France” an “hors category” climb and is one of the top 12 climbs in the U.S. (according to The Complete Guide to Climbing (By Bike), by John Summerson, Extreme Press, Winston-Salem, NC. 2007). Eighteen of the group did the full climb of 72 miles with about 9,000 feet of climbing for the full route. The weather was clear and most notable were two seemingly endless descents down banked switchbacks with good pavement with spectacular views to the sides.

There was a rest day for shorter optional rides and an opportunity for cultural excursions. Many visited either the Getty Museum or Villa, which were close by.
