DINOSAUR DROPPINGS

This Labor Day consider riding with a HeartCycle three day excursion to the Western Slope, organized and led by Mike Case.

Beginning and ending in Fruita Colorado, just 10 miles west of Grand Junction, HCs' 2006 Dinosaur Droppings will travel the 80 miles north from Fruita to Rangely Colorado on the first day, Saturday September 2nd. Riding the second day, Sunday September 3rd, one has the option of covering the full 108 miles to Echo Park located deep within Dinosaur National Monument, or riding only a portion of that distance. You pick the effort and distance that makes sense for you (and your derriere) on the second day. If you choose to ride only the 20 miles to the Dinosaur National Monument Visitors Center we think you'll find it a wonderfully serendipitous and secluded Colorado treasure. The third day, Monday September 3rd, will have HC returning the 80 miles back to Fruita passing the Canyon Pintado archeological site and traveling once again over Douglas Pass.

2006 Dinosaur Droppings

Sept. 1, **2-4**, 2006

160-270 miles/3 riding days, +/- 80 miles a day Fruita, Rangely and Dinosaur National Monument, Colorado

\$300.00 per person due on or before July 31, 2006 (lodging the evening of Fri. Sept. 1st is included)



On Saturday September 2nd 2006 HeartCycle will offer Dinosaur Droppings, a Labor Day weekend "pocket tour". We think this is an unusually interesting tour covering territory HC has not formally ridden in the past. The HC board may consider additional "pocket" tours (each exploring an overlooked area within a days travel from the Front Range) if Dinosaur Droppings runs successfully.

Dinosaur Droppings format will be that of a conventional HC tour. One or two sag vans (depending on the number of participants) will shepherd the ride. Food and beverage will be supplied from the sag van as usual and personal luggage will be transported in the sag in the standard HC fashion.

For all of the HC members outside of the immediate Front Range area don't despair. No promises can be made at this writing but if the response to this initial "pocket tour" is successful it is possible HC will consider additional efforts elsewhere. We'll see how this first attempt plays out.

With that in mind, HC encourages all interested members, or those interested in becoming members, to consider Dinosaur Droppings for the Labor Day weekend. Please read the write up for The Droppings included in this edition of Heart-2-Heart for an overview of the ride route and associated distances (see previous page).

One last item, we need to hear from all interested folks sooner rather than later. To secure lodging and organize logistics we need to have your registrations (and all your money!) no later than July 31st 2006. HC is hoping to have a minimum of 20 riders signed up by the end of July. So lets "Go the distance" this labor day weekend. And if you have any questions please don't hesitate to contact one of your board members – or perhaps Ray Kinsella, an avid cyclist, he can be reached somewhere in the cornfields of Iowa.
